RSB ensures also that, the Quality Policy and Quality Objectives are communicated and understood within the organization and regularly reviewed for their continuing suitability.

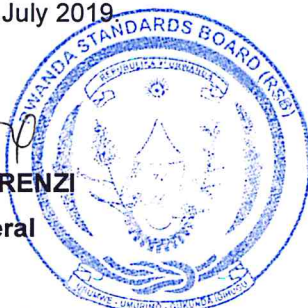
Quality Objectives.

1. RSB will continually satisfy stakeholders' demand by upgrading its standards development services where the number of new standards is increased annually at least by 10%.
2. Access to our delivered services will be improved where by June 2018 e-sales facilities of standards will be availed to our customers.
3. RSB focuses on international recognition of its delivered services and this will be evidenced by compliance of its services to the applicable standards.
4. RSB will continue to upgrade staff technical skills where by the end of each fiscal year the annual capacity development planned activities executed above 70%.
5. Launching of new three management systems training schemes (Environmental Management Systems, Occupational Health and Safety and Information Management Systems) by July 2019.
6. Development of modular courses on QMS, FSMS, HACCP and Guideline for management systems auditing by July 2019.
